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Course description

- Building on the material presented and discussed in the VU, students will choose a research project (from their own experience or an imaginary one), write a proposal for that project and then change roles... So they become evaluators for the project of another group.
- They have to assess the strengths and weaknesses of the project with regard to the different RRI dimensions.
- They will furthermore develop recommendations for an improved project design in case of identified deficits.
- In intermediate and final presentations, students showcase progress and will write a critical evaluation report.
- Finally a revised version of the project proposal is expected, implementing improvements and answering criticism from the evaluation reports.





Semester outline

Phase 1:

- 1. Find group, choose project (today)
- 2. Send project details & present decision (2nd meeting)
- 3. Write proposal for funding

Phase 2:

- 1. Send and present full project proposals (3rd meeting)
- 2. Change role to reviewer; assess other group's proposal critically, focus on RRI
- 3. Submit and present RRI-evaluation report (4th meeting)

Phase 3:

- 1. Include feedback into own proposal
- 2. Send revised proposal

Written Stuff...

- Short project description: What is it all about? Why are you doing this? Where are you going to apply for funding? (H2020, national research funds, venture capital investors, your own CEO... they are all deeply into RRI!)... 1 page
- <u>Full project proposal:</u> executive summary, budget, market analysis or scientific state of the art, innovative aspects, impact, RRI dimensions, risks, team competences... **about 3000 words**





Written Stuff...

- <u>Evaluation report:</u> Write a fair and thorough assessment... But: You're not going to fund a project which is not 100% RRI compliant... **about 2500 words**
- Final version of project proposal: incorporate the suggestions from the evaluation report (or explain why you will not change your proposal in this point), integrate feedback from the presentation, make the perfect proposal... 4000 words max





Grading factors

- (25%) project proposal (text, presentation, discussion)
- (25%) RRI-evaluation report (text, presentation, discussion)
- (50%) Revised project proposal (sufficiency, form/presentation, RRI dimensions, plausibility)

Find group
